## Recalls

### FDA Order Transvaginal Surgical Mesh Pulled from Market



The U.S. Food and Drug Administration ordered makers of transvaginal surgical mesh implants to immediately stop their sale and distribution in the United States. Tens of thousands of lawsuits have been filed in recent years against medical device manufacturers claiming their transvaginal mesh implants caused pain, perforations, urinary problems, bleeding and other injuries.

### Fisher-Price Recalls 4.7 Million Rock ‘n Play Sleepers Linked to Infant Deaths

The Rock ‘n Play Sleeper by Fisher-Price has been linked as many as 30 infant deaths since the product became available in 2009. After initially issuing a warning, Fisher-Price formally announced a recall of all models on April 12. Infants can roll from their back to their stomach or side while unrestrained.



### Salmonella-Contaminated Melon Linked to Nearly 100 Illnesses



The U.S. Food & Drug Administration has issued a warning about contaminated precut fruit that has been linked to salmonella illness in 93 people, requiring 23 of them to seek hospitalization. The precut fruit — cantaloupe, honeydew, and watermelon — was processed at a

Caito Foods LLC facility in Indianapolis and sold at Walmart, Trader Joe's, Whole Foods, Kroger and Target.

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
